

6th Annual ACFF Best of Fest in Frederick February 10, 2018

Films, Music, and Merriment Return to Weinberg Center for the Arts

The American Conservation Film Festival's **Best of Fest** returns to the Weinberg Center for the Arts in Frederick, MD, for the sixth year for an event including live music, beer tasting, three films, and discussion with river keepers and filmmakers.

This year will feature the 2017 Foreign Film Award winner, *Giraffes: Africa's Gentle Giants*; the 2017 Student Film Award winner, *Keeping the Potomac: The Politics of Water*, and a discussion with members of the Potomac Riverkeeper Network on how to protect our local waterways.
